HURRICANE SEASON

Well our season is over for another year and slowly but surely most everyone is making plans to head home if they have not already left. So for the rest of us who stay here year round its time to get prepared for the storm season which will get started June 1st. Here are some handy tips to remember.

If you are in an evacuation area :

*Decide now where you would go if you have to leave home. Leave early and determine your route ahead of time .

*Check your disaster supply kit and obtain any items you need.

*Keep your home in good repair . Tack down loose roofing and trim trees.

*secure windows and doors before the storm.

*inventory your property

(a videotape is excellent).

*Review your insurance policy with your agent whether you own or rent..

If you stay home:

*Make sure your windows are protected and your home is secured.

*Fill your bathtub for storing clean water: plan on three gallons per person, per day. Make sure you have plenty of drinking water.

*During the storm, stay inside away from windows, doors and skylights. *keep blankets and battery-operated radio on hand.

*wait for official word that the danger is over.

Here are some suggestions for your disaster supply kit:

*Two-week supply of non-perishable foods

*Non-electric can opener
*Flashlights and extra set of batteries for each family member

*First aid kit with bandages, antiseptic and aspirin

*Mosquito repellent

*Trash bags and plastic wrap

*Cash

*Your car is full of gas
